A crisis was sparked off when a delegate alleged Russian involvement in the horrific rape of three teenagers within the precincts of the Russian Embassy in Costa Rica. Several countries endorsed this view. An enraged Russia demanded a special investigation into the case, backed by Togo. Costa Rica opposed this move vehemently.
